BEGINNING OF A LEARNING JOURNEY

At Church Langton our curriculum, core values and simple school rules work together to guide children as they grow into curious, kind, confident and well-rounded individuals.

We strive each day to ensure every child feels excited to learn, experiences a strong sense of belonging and builds positive relationships with both peers and adults. Our broad and balanced curriculum is enriched by a deep commitment to creativity and the arts. We are especially proud of our unique *Enrichment Programme*, which all children from Year 1 onwards enjoy weekly as part of their timetable.

In Reception, the focus is on nurturing relationships, establishing routines and learning through practical, play-based activities. As children settle, they begin daily sessions in reading, writing and number work, alongside physical, social and communication development to support their overall growth.

In Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2) and Key Stage 2 (Years 3–6), children engage in daily English, Maths and Phonics (KS1), as well as retrieval practice to strengthen learning. Throughout the week, they enjoy a rich variety of subjects including Art or Design Technology, Music, Religious Education, PSHE, Geography or History, Science, Computing and two hours of PE. In Key Stage 2, children also begin learning a modern foreign language.

We look forward to sharing this exciting journey with you and welcoming your child into our vibrant school community.



WHAT SETS US APART



At Church Langton C of E Primary School we believe that children thrive when they are given opportunities to learn, explore and discover beyond the traditional classroom. Ofsted

We are proud that our April 2026 Ofsted inspection recognised Church Langton Primary School as a "warm, inclusive village school" where children feel happy, safe and valued. Inspectors praised our strong academic outcomes, excellent behaviour and high attendance, highlighting how pupils develop into independent, curious learners from their very first days in Reception and make secure progress throughout their school journey.

The report acknowledged our caring and nurturing environment, noting that pupils benefit from a calm, friendly atmosphere where they feel they belong. Inspectors also recognised our inclusive approach, high expectations for all children and the strong relationships between staff and pupils. In addition, our wide range of clubs, trips and residential experiences were celebrated for providing memorable opportunities that enrich learning beyond the classroom. This positive report reflects the dedication of our staff, the support of our families and the wonderful children who make our school such a special place to learn and grow.

SIAMS

Our school was inspected by SIAMS in March 2026. Whereas Ofsted report on the overall educational standards, SIAMS explores how a school's theologically rooted Christian vision influences everything—from leadership and curriculum to worship and relationships. We are proud that the report was a highly positive SIAMS inspection outcome, which recognised the school as a place where "pupils and adults are able to flourish." The inspection praised our strong Christian vision and values, which underpin a culture of kindness, inclusion and high expectations for all.

Inspectors highlighted our nurturing and caring environment, rich and engaging curriculum, meaningful collective worship and strong leadership of Religious Education. The report also celebrated our happy, respectful pupils and the strong sense of community that makes Church Langton such a special place to learn, grow and thrive.



EXAMPLE OF A SCHOOL DAY

School begins: Gate opens at 8:40am Registration at 8:55am

Lunch: 12.00-1.00pm (Reception Children will start their lunch at 11.45am)

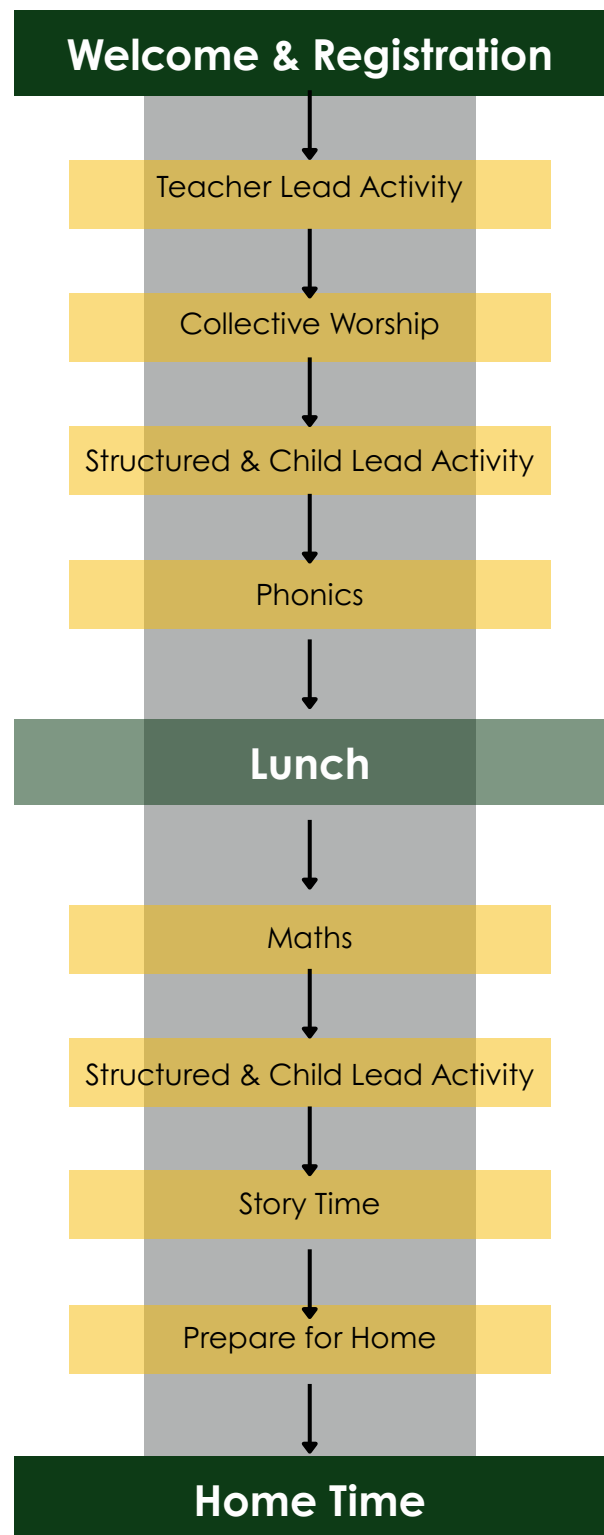
School ends: 3:15pm

While each day brings new learning experiences, we follow a consistent structure to help pupils feel settled and confident in their routine. After registration and the first lesson of the day, children gather in the main hall for Collective Worship - a valued time for reflection and togetherness. Learning then continues through the morning until lunchtime.

At lunchtime, we run our Happy Lunchtimes programme, which outlines clear expectations and promotes positive behaviour. Pupils are offered a range of structured activities they can choose to take part in, helping to make break times enjoyable and inclusive.

Following lunch, the afternoon is filled with further learning before children either head home or join our wrap-around care and extra-curricular clubs.

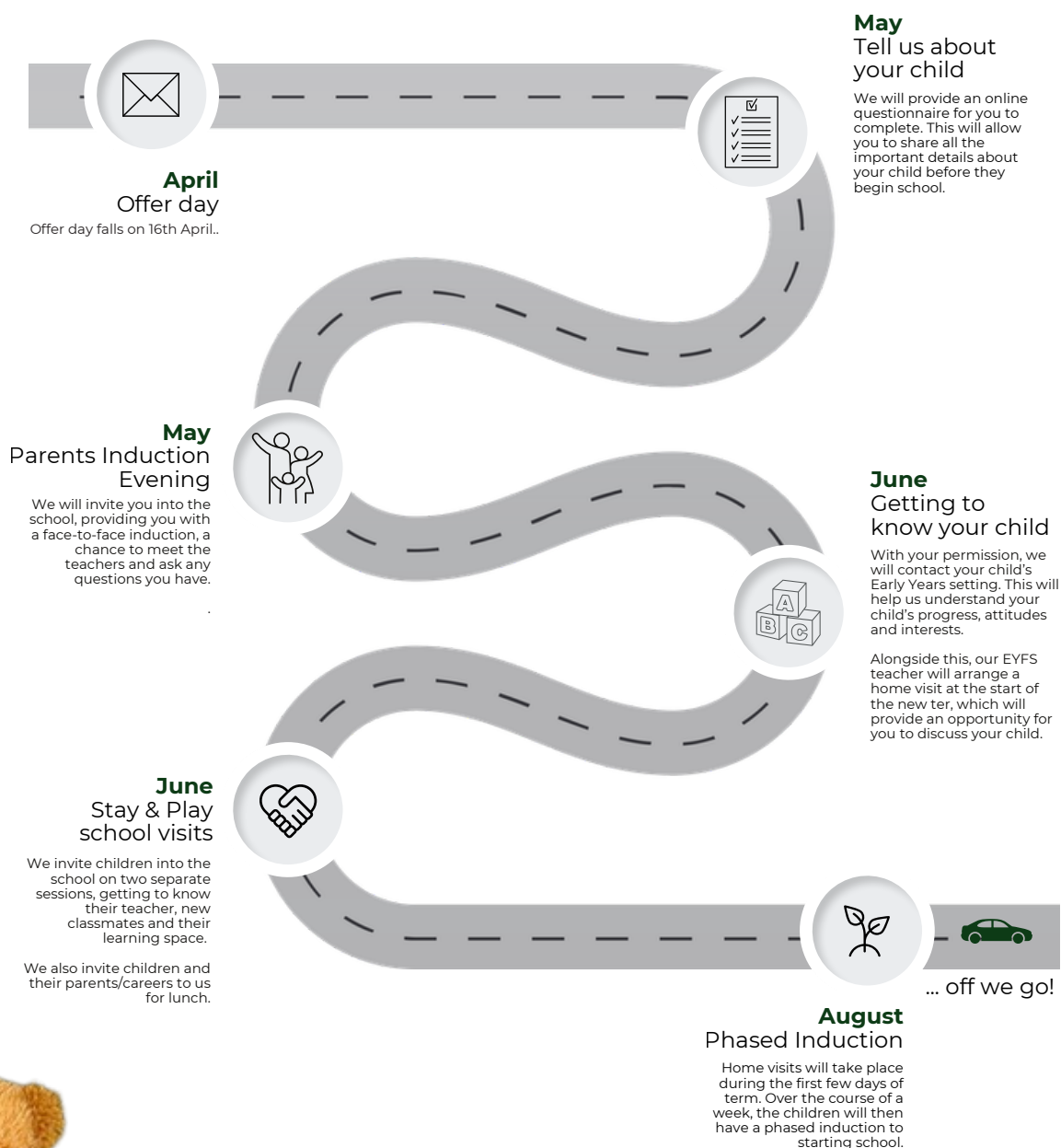
To the right is an example of our daily timetable, which over the week is intertwined with the full curriculum including subjects like PE and Music.

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WRAP-AROUND CARE & EXTRA CURRICULAR CLUBS

Church Langton's After School Club has proved a great success and is constantly changing to suit the demands of busy parents and active children. The club, run by school staff, is available for pupils of all year groups.

We provide themed arts and crafts, messy play, outdoor play, table and floor activities. After School Club starts at 3.15pm when a member of staff will collect children from the school hall. The children are then taken to the Langton Community Hall but also make use of the school field and 3G pitch.

SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION

Church Langton C of E Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The Governing Body has a duty of care to pupils and all members of the school community. All staff and volunteers have regular training in child protection. There is a comprehensive Safeguarding Policy in place which, along with a policy for Health and Safety and a Prevent Strategy, is regularly reviewed by the Governing Body.

Our Safeguarding Policy can be found on the school website and is also available upon request from the school office.

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the school have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind, or whether it is thought that a child may be at risk.
- In some cases the school is obliged to refer children to children's social care, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required. In many cases there will already have been discussions between school staff and the parents of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the school has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.

If you reside in Leicestershire and wish to apply for a place at our school, please begin by completing the online application form available at www.leics.gov.uk/admissions.

- Offer Day: 16 April 2027
- Appeals: For details on how to appeal an offer, please visit our school website.

School Admissions Checklist

Step 1: How to get started - preparing to apply

- ☐ Create a [parent portal account](#) or check you can still log in.
- ☐ Create or change to a password you can remember.
- ☐ Keep a note of the email address you applied with – you must use the same email address to log in later.

Step 2: List your school preferences

- ☐ Include your catchment school in your preferences, or the nearest local school if there is no defined catchment area. This will help increase your chance to securing a place at your nearby school.
- ☐ Maximise your opportunities by listing up to 5 different school preferences.
- ☐ Double check your order of preferences- we always aim to try to offer the highest preference where possible.
- ☐ You must apply to your nearest schools if you wish to be considered for school transport

Step 3: Check your catchment areas

- ☐ Visit your local school website.
- ☐ Contact the school directly to check your catchment area.

Step 4: Review your order of preferences

- ☐ Check your details are correct before you submit your application.

TOP TIPS

1. Check out our [School Admissions webpages](#).
2. Attend open days, visit schools before finalising your choices.
3. Don't assume school transport is available – arrangements can be different from what you expect. More on our [school transport policy and eligibility](#).
4. Remember late applications will be processed after those that were sent on time.
5. Help your child get [school ready](#) if applying for the first time.
6. Download our ["Moving Up" booklet](#) to help anyone transitioning on to secondary school.
7. Choosing one school will not guarantee a place.
8. If none of your preferences are offered, you may be allocated a school further away.
9. Don't assume - boundaries can be different than you expect and in some instances you may live in a catchment with multiple schools.
10. If you make changes or even re-open your application to check your submitted application, you must then click the **RESUBMIT** button - if you don't your application status is unsubmitted.
